

HAVE A CRIMINAL RECORD?

HAVING PROBLEMS REGISTERING TO VOTE?



IN NEW YORK, YOU CAN REGISTER TO VOTE EVEN IF YOU HAVE A CRIMINAL CONVICTION, IF:

- ➔ You have been discharged from parole; OR
- ➔ You are currently on probation; OR
- ➔ You have been pardoned; OR
- ➔ Your maximum sentence has expired; OR
- ➔ You have been convicted but have not been sentenced to imprisonment, or if the sentence of imprisonment has been suspended; OR
- ➔ You have been convicted of a misdemeanor.

★ YOU DO NOT NEED TO PROVIDE ANY SPECIAL DOCUMENTATION IN ORDER TO REGISTER TO VOTE

IF YOU HAVE PROBLEMS REGISTERING TO VOTE, HELP IS AVAILABLE...

If you think you are eligible to vote but have been told by the Board of Elections that you are not eligible, or you have been told that you need to provide some type of documentation such as a Certificate of Relief from Disabilities, you can get help.
