



## Student Safety Act Reporting on Arrests and Summonses

3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter 2012

### GENERAL DATA

There were 205 arrests and summons – more than 4 per day. There were 34 middle and 45 high school days during the third quarter of 2012 (July 1 – Sept. 30). That includes summer school and 15 regular school days.
