



## Student Safety Act Reporting on Arrests and Summonses

July 1, 2013 – June 30, 2014

### GENERAL DATA

There were 956 arrests and summonses – more than 4 per day – during the four quarters of the 2013 – 2014 school year. Including summer school, there were 209 high school days and 202 middle school days during this 12-month period.
