

Student Safety Act Reporting on Arrests and Summonses

3rd Quarter 2011

GENERAL DATA

If you count arrests, summonses, and non-criminal incidents, there were 625 incidents – more than 13 per day. There are 41 middle and 48 high school days during the 3rd quarter reporting (July 1-Sept. 30). That includes summer school and 15 regular school days.
