



Student Safety Act Reporting on Arrests and Summonses

4th Quarter 2012

GENERAL DATA

There were 337 arrests and summons – more than 6 per day. There were 55 school days during the fourth quarter of 2012 (Oct. 1 – Dec. 31).

- 31.1% age 17
- 18.4% age 18
- 10.7% ages 19
- 20.9% ages 20+
