



## Student Safety Act Reporting on Arrests and Summonses

3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter 2013

### GENERAL DATA

There were 111 arrests and summons – more than 2 per day. There were 35 middle and 44 high school days during the third quarter of 2013 (July 1 – Sept. 30).
