

Student Safety Act Reporting on Arrests and Summonses

July 1, 2012 - June 30, 2013

GENERAL DATA

There were 1,367 arrests and summons – more than 6 per day – during the four quarters of the 2012-2013 school year. Including summer school, there were 208 high school days and 197 middle school days during this 12 month period.
