



Student Safety Act Reporting on Arrests and Summonses

3rd Quarter 2014

GENERAL DATA

There were 145 arrests and summons – more than 3 per day. There were 45 high school and 39 middle school days during the third quarter of 2014 (July 1 – September 30).
