

Student Safety Act Reporting on Arrests and Summonses

July 1, 2014 – June 30, 2015

GENERAL DATA

There were 775 arrests and summonses – almost 4 per day – during the four quarters of the 2013 – 2014 school year. Including summer school, there were 210 high school days and 206 middle school days during this 12-month period.
