**DURING COVID-19**

Voting is the right we use to secure all our other rights. There are ways to vote while practicing social distancing and keeping safe.

**ELECTION DAY IS  
NOVEMBER 3, 2020**

To vote in November, you must be registered to vote by October 9, 2020.

Verify your registration by visiting [voterlookup.elections.ny.gov](https://voterlookup.elections.ny.gov)

**Every registered voter has the right to vote by mail this November**



## **VOTING BY MAIL**

- To vote by mail, you must first submit an absentee ballot application here: <https://www.elections.ny.gov/VotingAbsentee.html>. You can apply for your absentee ballot by mail, phone, online or in-person with your county board of elections. Verify the address at which you are registered to vote at [voterlookup.elections.ny.gov](https://voterlookup.elections.ny.gov).
- To vote absentee due to the COVID-19 pandemic, you must indicate that you are requesting an absentee ballot due to "Temporary Illness."
- After your application has been approved, you will receive an absentee ballot in the mail. Carefully follow the directions provided on the absentee ballot.
- To avoid postal delays and any problems counting your vote, apply for and send in your absentee ballot as early as possible.
- If you prefer not to mail your absentee ballot, you may deliver it to any early voting or election day poll site, or to your board of elections office.

**October 14:** Last day to file a change of address

**October 27:** Last day to postmark absentee ballot applications

**November 2:** Last day to apply for an absentee ballot in person



## **VOTING IN-PERSON EARLY OR ON ELECTION DAY**

Some polling sites will be open for early voting from: Saturday, October 24 to Sunday, November 1.
